2.5 passengers per hour use trolley service in March

The city's trolley service attracted an average of 1.2 passengers an hour in February and 2.5 passengers per hour in March.

Records obtained by the *South Florida Sun-Sentinel* show there were 252 passengers in February and 3,949 passengers in March.

The city began a trolley service on Feb. 22 to shuttle business workers throughout the midtown area, which includes high-profile spots such as

Broward Mall, Westside Regional Medical Center, the library, county courthouse and the growing Broward County Governmental Center satellite office.

City documents show the residential population is about 1,600 people, but at least 20,000 people work in the area. The goal is to get people from their offices to any number of stores and restaurants for errands and lunch.

Six orange-and-green, 22-seat buses offer free rides from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. weekdays.
